Women of Toledo presented, along with LISC Toledo and Welcome TLC, the 2nd Annual Multicultural Twilight Market (MTM) at the Toledo Farmer's Market on June 3, 2023, in conjunction with Immigrant Heritage Month. Open to all, MTM offered family-friendly fun activities organized by the University of Toledo Center of International Studies and the Young Women of Toledo Girls Hub initiative. Other activities included music and performances from around the world including the African drum, the Middle Eastern dance, and the Culture of Mexico through folkloric dance.

Presented by Clark Schaffer Hackett, PNC Bank, and Lucas County Board of Commissioners, we had well over 70 vendors and businesses representing the BIPOC+, women+, and immigrant-owned small businesses in our ecosystem. Supported by Jumpstart, the City of Toledo Economic Development and Human Relations Commission, three businesses that participated in business development opportunities were eligible to receive a mini-grant via the voting session for People Choice's Award.
