Dr. Julia Mazak

Senior Gear Engineer (Belgium)

Dr. Julia Mazak works as Senior Gear Engineer at Dana Inc. World Headquarters in Maumee, Toledo. After finishing her Master of Production Engineering in Aachen, Germany, she worked as a researcher at the Laboratory for Machine Tools there. For one of

her research projects, she was awarded the 2019 "Project of the Year" award of German Machine Builders' Association (VDW). She was accepted to the TANDEMdok mentoring program aimed at women in STEM post-graduate programs. After obtaining her PhD with distinction, she worked for Dana in Brugge, Belgium. Dr. Mazak now lives with her Moroccan husband and American kitten in Perrysburg.



## **Dr. Nazarene Eunice Tubman**

Healthcare Administrator (Liberia)

Dr. Tubman holds her Doctor of Healthcare Administration and a Master of Business Administration. She is a public health practitioner, an educator, and former Superintendent (Governor) of Maryland County, Liberia. She is a mother and

grandmother. As Superintendent of Maryland County and the first woman to hold the position in the county, she remained focused on improving health, women's empowerment, and county development following the destruction caused by the war. Her leadership laid the foundation to ensure the county was not impacted by the Ebola epidemic. She founded Caring Hands for Liberia prior to returning to Liberia to live and led medical mission trips to provide free medical and dental care. Dr. Tubman is passionate about education and continues to pay tuition for a few students in Liberia yearly. She resides in Perrysburg, OH where she now teaches doctoral students and mentors them on their research and dissertation. She is also her mother's caregiver.



## **Naz Tubman**

Director, Vaccines Clinical Dev, Dr Tubman's Daughter

Nazarene Tubman is a first generation Liberian American. Due to the civil wars in Liberia, her family sought refuge in the United States where she grew up in Gaithersburg, Maryland, USA. She holds her degree in Public Policy Analysis with a concentration in Health Policy from the University of North Carolina

at Chapel Hill. Nazarene is currently pursuing her Master of Public Health at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with an expected completion of May 2022. For the past 15 years, Nazarene has worked in clinical research and currently serves as a Director, Vaccine Clinical Development overseeing global zika, chikungunya, flu, and COVID/flu combination vaccine studies



## **Major Demelza Newlove**

Australian Army Reservist (Australia)

Major Demelza Newlove is currently an Australian Army Reservist employed as an Exchange Officer at Bowling Green State University Army Reserve Officer Training Course (BGSU ROTC). She has extensive international exercise and deployed experience with conventional and special forces as a logistics

specialist. Initially she earned a Bachelor of Engineering from the Australian National University, and later a Master of Business to further her interest in global economics. She is a qualified Gender Advisor accredited by the United Nations Women Peace and Security department. Before moving to the USA her civilian profession focussed on improving women's financial security through education. MAJ Newlove now lives in Toledo in a "renovator's delight" with an Australian husband and an Australian cayoodle dog called "Rabbit".

Born in Toledo, Ohio, Ramona was reared in Lansing, Michigan, by a jazz pianist/singer mother - the late Alice (Collins) Carter. Midwest and beyond and been honored for her contributions to the arts in her hometown of Toledo and been voted Best of Toledo in jazz/blues in 2015, 2016, 2018 and nominated in that category for 2019 and 2020. In 2011 she was nominated in the female jazz vocalist category for the Detroit Black Music Awards. She is a past president of the Toledo Jazz Society and was the driving force behind naming the former Art Tatum Jazz Festival. She is very active in her community and currently sits on several boards including as a trustee on the board of the Arts Commission of Greater Toledo. She is a founding member of Women of Toledo. She has taken aspiring young performers under her wing educating, supporting, and encouraging them.
